**Crossroads Pastoral Charge has been supporting a young girl through Plan Canada for approximately 5 years. Her name is Betty Nangobi and she lives in Uganda. She turned 14 in February and she attends primary school. Her favorite subject is math. According to Betty's family she has been healthy and has not suffered any serious illnesses. The nearest health facility is about 45 minutes away. Betty's family situation remains the same-she lives with her mother and grandmother. Plan International Uganda has worked with children, their families, government, local leaders and other area members and in the past year have worked on the following types of projects:**

- 1. Maternal child health**
- 2. Community based safe water, good hygiene and sanitation practices**
- 3. Promote access to quality basic education for girls and boys**
- 4. Strengthen community child protection systems**
